

America's Other Independence Day

arching bands, hot dogs on the grill, fireworks exploding

Every summer, we look forward to America's 4th of July Celebration - a day that commemorates our country's independence from British rule.

But there's another Independence Day that takes place in June. Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, Texas in 1865 to ensure that all enslaved people be freed. Their arrival came a full two and a half years after President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation which established that all enslaved people in Confederate states "shall be then.

thenceforward, and forever free."

Unfortunately Lincoln's Proclamation didn't instantly free any enslaved people.

It wasn't until after the Civil War ended that freedmen in Texas organized the

first annual celebration of "Jubilee Day" on June 19. In the ensuing decades, luneteenth commemorations featured music, barbecues, prayer services and other activities. As Black people migrated from Texas to other parts of the country, so did the Juneteenth tradition.



How cool is that?!





Village is today was originally called Cork Ave. Dakota Ave., Cork Ave., and Inman Ave. all intersected near where the British pay phone sits today.

The only portion left of Cork Ave. today is called Snow Ave. Hyde Park Village today is a charming area with locally-owned and national boutiques and restaurants.
